Founded in 1995, this ministry’s vision is to reach out to men, women, and children of the Devadasi (temple prostitution) community; to rescue girls and boys from the Devadasi system; to provide, care for, and educate Devadasi children; to provide job-oriented training and develop natural gifts and skills; and to address the many needs of HIV+ Devadasis and their families. Shadyside Presbyterian Church has hosted the founders on numerous visits to Pittsburgh, most recently in September 2016. Also last year, in January, a mission team from Shadyside first traveled to India to visit this ministry, display support, and envision opportunities to better walk alongside our partners in India.
