We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.

If you are a guest with us this morning, our ushers are available to assist you.

Nursery care is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

Children in Worship - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

Fifth Avenue Parking - Parking on the inbound side of the block from Wilkins Avenue to Amberson Avenue is not available for parking on Sunday mornings. Parking is available on the outbound side as well as both sides of Fifth Avenue from Amberson Avenue into Oakland. Mission Partner Spotlight

Our mission partner ConeXión Mosaico is working to eradicate injustice, poverty, and spiritual emptiness in the urban slums of the Chimalhuacan region of Mexico City. Founded in 2005, ConeXión Mosaico, led by Jean-Luc Krieg, has planted several house churches, is training and accompanying local pastors in holistic ministry, leading evangelistic Bible studies, training emerging youth leaders, and facilitating the growth of a new organization of residents who are organizing around community issues.

Shadyside Presbyterian Church members visited this ministry in 2009 and have committed to support their healthcare initiative, called ProSalud. Since the initial commitment of Shadyside's International Partnerships Mission Action Community (MAC), eight teams have traveled to the Chimalhuacan region, providing construction, educational, and medical services to several slum communities in central Mexico. Our most recent project with ConeXión Mosaico involves a major financial commitment over three consecutive years to develop CentroRenovar, a spiritual retreat center in the mountains northeast of Mexico City.

From March 4 through 18, two separate teams will aid in the construction of this renewal center, which will provide support for local pastors, missionaries, volunteers, and future mission teams. Please keep the participants – listed below and commissioned this morning during worship – in prayer as they travel. The team will distribute prayer cards after worship.

About This Morning's Music

At the age of 14, John Ireland (1879–1962) entered the Royal College of Music, where he studied under Charles Villiers Stanford. Ireland eventually taught at the Royal College of Music, where Benjamin Britten was one of his students. Ireland wrote chamber music, church music, film scores, piano solos, art songs, and concerti. He worked as organist and choirmaster at St. Luke's, Chelsea, between 1904 and 1926, while developing his career as a composer. His last major work was the film score for *The Overlanders* (1946–1947).

Kenneth Leighton (1929–1988) studied at Queen's College, Oxford, graduating with degrees in classics and music. In 1955, he was appointed to the faculty of music at the University of Edinburgh. Leighton was one of the most distinguished of the British post-war composers; over one hundred compositions are published, and his work is frequently performed and broadcast in Britain as well as in other countries. He wrote church music, chamber music, organ and solo piano music, in addition to large-scale orchestral works and an opera (op.77, 1978) based on the life of Columba (libretto by the poet Edwin Morgan). The sacred and liturgical music is widely known and performed regularly in both Europe and America. As a pianist, Kenneth Leighton was a frequent recitalist and broadcaster, both as a soloist and in chamber music.
