

# Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

**Children in Worship** - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through fifth-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in chapel worship and children's activities. **Flower Ministry** - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

**Fifth Avenue Parking** - Parking on the inbound side of the block from Wilkins Avenue to Amberson Avenue is not available for parking on Sunday mornings. 

## About This Morning’s Music

Joseph Haydn wrote his oratorio, *The Creation*, between 1797 and 1798. The oratorio is perhaps his best-known work. It depicts and celebrates the Creation of the world as described in the Book of Genesis and *Paradise Lost*. The soloists represent the archangels Gabriel, Uriel, and Raphael, and, in Part III, Adam and Eve. The chorus, “The Heavens Are Telling,” is the most-recognizable chorus from the work.

Haydn’s oeuvre was tremendous, including 106 symphonies, 68 string quartets (he is considered the “father” of the string quartet genre), and twelve masses (six short, six large).

Edward Elgar’s oratorio, *The Apostles*, was first performed in 1903. Elgar chose the text from various parts of the New Testament and the Apocrypha. The oratorio is a narrative work, dealing with the calling of the Apostles and their experiences of Jesus’ preaching, crucifixion, and ascension. “The Spirit of the Lord” is the prologue.

## Mission Partner Spotlight

Over the past seven years, Shadyside Presbyterian Church has responded to the interruption of our normal Sunday morning worship due to the Pittsburgh Marathon by joining in the festivities. This year, our Marathon efforts will directly benefit our mission partner, Open Hand Ministries (OHM). OHM is a ministry of four churches located in Garfield and East Liberty committed to promoting justice and equality through homeownership. OHM helps to revitalize the community by converting abandoned properties into safe and energy-efficient homes. OHM also helps first-time homeowners to develop the skills which will lead them to financial stability and strength.

SPC and OHM are welcoming runners of any ability over the age of 16 to join in running with a purpose at the 2016 Pittsburgh Marathon on Sunday, May 1. The Marathon has generously provided a discount for our five relay teams, at only \$25 per person. The marathon relay divides the 26.2-mile marathon course into five legs. They are, in order, 5.5, 3.5, 6.4, 6.1, and 4.7 miles. We look toward a goal of \$8,000 in donations to further the work of OHM; runners are encouraged to raise support.

All runners – young and old, seasoned and beginners – are welcome to sign up. If you would like to join a relay team or assemble your own team, please attend the informational meeting in the Hulme Room next Sunday, January 31, following worship, or you may contact Rev. John Magnuson for additional information.
