

# Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

**Fifth Avenue Parking** - Parking on the inbound side of the block from Wilkins Avenue to Amberson Avenue is not available for parking on Sunday mornings. ## About This Morning's Music

Both Thomas Weelkes and Orlando Gibbons belong to the Tudor-Stuart era of British composition. In a sense, both are extremely conservative, considering Monteverdi and his Italian contemporaries were creating what would become the Baroque style during the same period. The Baroque did not really penetrate England until the end of the 1600s with Henry Purcell. Despite their different sensibilities, what unites Weelkes and Gibbons is their concern for the meaning of the words they set.

Orlando Gibbons (1583–1625), considered the finest keyboard player of his age, began his highly successful musical career as a chorister at King's College, Cambridge, where his brother Edward led the choir. He became the senior organist of the Chapel Royal and held two other important musical posts at court.

Thomas Weelkes (1576–1623) was an English organist and composer, and one of the most important composers of madrigals. He was organist at Chichester Cathedral (where he frequently was reprimanded for a variety of reasons, including bad language and drunkenness). Weelkes wrote more Anglican service music than any other composer of his time.

Open Hand Ministries (OHM) is a ministry of four churches located in Garfield and East Liberty committed to promoting justice and equality through homeownership. OHM helps to revitalize the community by converting abandoned properties into safe and energy-efficient homes. OHM also helps first-time homeowners to develop the skills which will lead them to financial stability and strength, and continues in relationship with these families long after they move in.

Shadyside volunteers help to renovate these homes, doing everything from demolition at the start of the project to painting at the end. OHM welcomes volunteers to join them on the first Saturday of each month; no prior experience required. There also are opportunities to participate in the client care teams which walk alongside the families as they prepare for homeownership and beyond.

In addition, thirty members and friends of Shadyside Presbyterian Church are preparing to run with OHM in the Pittsburgh Marathon on Sunday, May 1.
