*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

**Fifth Avenue Parking** - Parking on the inbound side of the block from Wilkins Avenue to Amberson Avenue is not available for parking on Sunday mornings. 
## PRAYER OF CONFESSION *(spoken in unison)*

## About This Morning's Music

The offering anthem is based on the 9<sup>th</sup>-century hymn “Veni Creator Spiritus” (“Come, Creator Spirit”), believed to have been written by Rabanus Maurus, a Frankish Benedictine monk, the archbishop of Mainz in Germany, and a theologian. This tune (see our hymnal, no. 125) appears halfway through the anthem, somewhat hidden in the alto line and accompanied by the other three parts. The anthem was commissioned by Peter Fyfe (1924–May 7, 2016), longtime organist and choirmaster of Christ Church Cathedral, Nashville, and one of the leading church musicians of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The composer, Gerald Near (b. 1942), is considered one of the finest composers of church music writing today. He was a student of Leo Sowerby, Leslie Bassett, and Gustav Meier. His music is performed in churches throughout the United States, Canada, and western Europe.
