

# Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

**Children in Worship** - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through fifth-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in chapel worship and children's activities. **Prayer Request Cards** - You are invited to write on a Prayer Request Card the names of those who are sick or in need of intercessory prayer.

**Flower Ministry** - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

**Individual listening devices** for improved sound are available for those with hearing needs. Please see an usher in the Narthex.

**Fifth Avenue Parking** - Parking on the inbound side of the block from Wilkins Avenue to Amberson Avenue is not available for parking on Sunday mornings. Parking is available on the outbound side as well as both sides of Fifth Avenue from Amberson Avenue into Oakland. We appreciate your helpfulness utilizing these available parking areas on Sunday mornings.



## About This Morning's Music

The organ music all comes from Felix Mendelssohn's Sixth Sonata. The first four variations are based on the hymn, "Our Father Who in Heaven Art" (hymn no. 590). This is the tune to which the Lord's Prayer has been sung in the German Lutheran Church since 1538, when Martin Luther wrote a paraphrase of the prayer in his native German. Luther dedicated one stanza to each of the seven petitions, framing it with an opening and a closing stanza. The tune was from an unknown source, likely a fifteenth-century German folksong. The fugue theme consists of fragments of the opening and closing hymn phrases. The finale is set in major, and resembles Mendelssohn's aria, "O Rest in the Lord," from *Elijah*.

Shadyside also contributed funds to provide a bio-shelter at the main garden site. The gardens continue to flourish, and GCF welcomes volunteers to join them on Thursday evenings and the first Saturday of each month.
