

# Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

**Children in Worship** - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in chapel worship and children's activities. **Flower Ministry** - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

**Individual listening devices** for improved sound are available for those with hearing needs. Please see an usher in the Narthex.

**Fifth Avenue Parking** - Parking on the inbound side of the block from Wilkins Avenue to Amberson Avenue is not available for parking on Sunday mornings. Parking is available on the outbound side as well as both sides of Fifth Avenue from Amberson Avenue into Oakland. We appreciate your helpfulness utilizing these available parking areas on Sunday mornings.



## About This Morning's Music

Noel Rawsthorne (b. 1929) was organist of Liverpool Cathedral for twenty-five years and city organist and artistic director at St. George's Hall, Liverpool. He also was senior lecturer in music at St. Katherine's College, Liverpool, for thirty-nine years.

Michael McCabe (b. 1941) studied with Leo Sowerby, David McK. Williams, Thomas Matthews, and Dale Wood. He has served numerous churches, including Grace Cathedral in San Francisco. He has written music for choir, solo instruments, and chamber ensembles.

Carlyle Sharpe (b. 1965) is professor of music at Drury University and a widely commissioned composer. His choral music is widely performed throughout North and South America, Europe, Australia, and Asia. His music has been premiered at several significant venues including the Kennedy Center, Carnegie Hall, and the Tanglewood Festival. Prior to his current position at Drury University, Dr. Sharpe taught at Boston University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

## Sesquicentennial Celebration

..... Sunday, October 2, at 10:45 a.m. in the Sanctuary .....

In 2016, Shadyside Presbyterian Church celebrates 150 years of ministry in Pittsburgh and around the world. On Sunday, October 2, the church commemorates its sesquicentennial anniversary with an extended service of worship beginning at 10:45 a.m. with a prelude for brass, timpani, and organ. The service also will include a homily of celebration preached by the Reverend Dr. Conrad C. Sharps; the participation of past ministers in observance of World Communion Sunday, first celebrated at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933; and music commissioned by the church and composed by Mark A.
