We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.

If you are a guest with us this morning, our ushers are available to assist you.

Nursery care is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

Children in Worship - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in chapel worship and children's activities. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

Fifth Avenue Parking - Parking on the inbound side of the block from Wilkins Avenue to Amberson Avenue is not available for parking on Sunday mornings. Parking is available on the outbound side as well as both sides of Fifth Avenue from Amberson Avenue into Oakland. About This Morning's Music

One of the most prominent and prolific composers of our time, Stephen Paulus (1949-2014) wrote over 400 works which have received premieres and performances throughout the world. "Pilgrim's Hymn" comes from a one-act religious opera, *The Three Hermits* (Tolstoy), commissioned by House of Hope Presbyterian Church in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Isaac Watts is considered the "Father of English Hymnody." An author and theologian, he is credited with close to 750 hymn texts. Prior to Watts, the primary Calvinist approach to using the Psalms in Protestant congregational singing was to translate and set the Psalms in meter. Watts, being a skilled poet, began to incorporate broader Biblical poetry into his Psalm-based texts. He felt the Psalms should be "renovated" as if David had been a Christian, or, as Watts put it in the title of his 1719 metrical Psalter, they should be "imitated in the language of the New Testament." Sacred music scholar Stephen Marini believes Watts' verses achieved an "axiomatic quality" that "presented Christian doctrinal content with the explicit confidence that befits affirmations of faith." Marini cites the hymns "Joy to the World" and "From All That Dwell Below the Skies" as two such examples. Our hymnal contains thirteen of Watts' hymn texts.

Mission Partner Spotlight

Our mission partner ConeXión Mosaico is working to eradicate injustice, poverty, and spiritual emptiness in the urban slums of the Chimalhuacan region of Mexico City. Founded in 2005, ConeXión Mosaico, led by Jean-Luc Krieg, has planted several house churches, is training and accompanying local pastors in holistic ministry, leading evangelistic Bible studies, training emerging youth leaders, and facilitating the growth of a new organization of residents who are organizing around community issues.

Shadyside Presbyterian Church members visited this ministry in 2009 and have committed to support their health care initiative, called ProSalud. Since the initial commitment of Shadyside's International Partnerships Mission Action Community (MAC), eight teams have traveled to the Chimalhuacan region, providing construction, educational, and medical services to several slum communities in central Mexico. Our most recent project with ConeXión Mosaico involves a major financial commitment over three consecutive years to develop CentroRenovar, a spiritual retreat center in the mountains northeast of Mexico City. The spring 2017 mission teams will be working on this renewal center.
