

# Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

**Children in Worship** - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in chapel worship and children's activities. 



## About This Morning's Music

Robert Powell (b. 1932) is an American composer, organist, and conductor. He studied at Union Theological Seminary in New York, and was assistant organist at the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine. He later was Director of Music at St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire. His final appointment was Director of Music and Organist of Christ Church (Episcopal) of Greenville, South Carolina, from 1968 to 2003. He has composed in nearly all genres of church music, including anthems, service music, organ music, music for handbell choir, and large-scale oratorios.

Welsh composer William Mathias only lived to be 57 years old, but composed a large amount of work. Mathias wrote in different styles; some of his influences were Stravinsky, Bartok, Tippett, and Gershwin, hardly known as Welsh-style composers. In 1959, Mathias began teaching at University College in Bangor, where he remained until 1988. It was in Bangor that he wrote many works and became well-known to the public, beginning with his Second Piano Concerto, first performed in 1960. Mathias composed more significant works, including the Celtic Dances and the Harp Concerto, *Lux Aeterna*, and other choral music, in addition to chamber music, his Third Piano Concerto, Symphony No. 2 (Summer Music), and an opera, *The Servants*. His career reached a high point – and a worldwide audience – in 1981 when he received a royal commission for an anthem to be performed in St. Paul's Cathedral for the wedding of Prince Charles and Lady Diana. The work, “Let the People Praise Thee, O God,” was a setting of Psalm 67 for chorus and organ, and was heard by about 750 million television viewers. Queen Elizabeth II made him a Commander of the British Empire in 1985.

## Mission Partner Spotlight

Garfield Community Farm (GCF) seeks to learn, teach, and practice organic gardening and farming in the places that have been neglected and abandoned in and with the neighborhood of Garfield. Neighborhood interns, volunteers from local churches and neighborhood groups, and GCF's small staff helped the farm have its first successful growing season in 2009.

Shadyside's Hunger and Homelessness Mission Action Community (MAC) has helped plant and harvest crops, in addition to helping prepare the soil and building a fence around the perimeter of the gardens. Shadyside also contributed funds to provide a bio-shelter at the main garden site. The gardens continue to flourish, and GCF welcomes volunteers to join them on Thursday evenings and the first Saturday of each month.
