**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you.



## About This Morning's Music

English composer Christopher Tye (1505–ca. 1572) was Organist and Choirmaster at Ely Cathedral. Tye served as one of the chief musical advisors to the court of King Edward VI, a strong proponent of the Reformation. Mid-career, Tye became a priest and served the church in Doddington, Cambridgeshire.

William Byrd (ca. 1529–1623), a prolific English composer of over 450 works, wrote both sacred and secular choral, keyboard, and instrumental music. He composed a large body of music for the Anglican service, though he converted to Catholicism sometime in the late 1560s.

Bavarian Max Reger (1873–1916) composed choral, orchestral, chamber, and vocal music, but is most known for his massive amount of literature for the organ. Though a late Romantic composer, he relied heavily on Baroque forms, infusing them with increasingly heavy chromaticism. In 1907, he became professor of composition at the Leipzig Conservatory and musical director at the University of Leipzig. He took on the post of conductor of the court orchestra at Meiningen in 1911.

## Mission Partner Spotlight

Promised Land Ministries (PLM) is a multifaceted mission ministry based in Guatemala City. Shadyside has partnered with PLM's Spring of Hope mission, which provides educational services and a feeding program to some of the poorest children in the Lake Atitlan region. Shadyside also helps to support the Genesareth Medical Clinic, based in San Lucas Tolimán. Members from Shadyside have traveled three times to this region, conducting medical clinics in partnership with the Genesareth Clinic, providing Vacation Bible Schools for the Spring of Hope's children, and assisting in construction of homes for the most vulnerable in the region. Shadyside also has hosted Director Jorge Santizo twice in the past. In addition, Shadyside members sponsor the education costs for thirty-two students (comprising one entire class) attending the Promised Land School.
