

Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.

On the Day of Pentecost, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit descending in a mighty rush of wind and flame to inspire the Church's proclamation of Christ's rising and to empower its mission and ministry to the world. (See Acts 2:1-13; see also Joel 2:28-32.) The notion of Easter as a season of fifty days ending at Pentecost is patterned after the ancient Jewish observance of seven weeks that culminated at the Festival of Weeks, which later came to be called Pentecost ("fiftieth day") by Greek-speaking Jews.

If you are a guest with us this morning, our ushers are available to assist you.

Nursery care is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with a video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex.

Children in Worship - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in chapel worship and children's activities. (If you are a first-time guest, please accompany your child to the Chapel, and then you may return to the Sanctuary.) Parents should meet their children in the Christian education classrooms after worship. On the first Sunday of the month, first- and second-graders stay in worship through the entire service for Communion. A bulletin insert designed for children is available in the Narthex.

Flower Ministry - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

Prayer Request Cards - You are invited to write on a Prayer Request Card the names of those who are sick or in need of intercessory prayer.

Enlarged bulletins and individual listening devices for improved sound are available in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary. Please see an usher for assistance.

Prayer Ministry - Every Sunday following worship, Stephen Ministers will be available in the front of the left transept to pray with anyone who would like prayer. All are welcome.

Time of Fellowship immediately follows worship. Please join us after the service for light refreshments and an opportunity to greet each other.

About This Morning's Music

The tune for the opening hymn, *Aberystwyth*, was composed by Welsh composer Joseph Parry. Aberystwyth is a Welsh Sea resort on the Cardigan Bay. Parry's family moved to Danville, Pennsylvania, when he was five years old. The text is by American hymn writer Thomas Troeger. The text was commissioned for a service celebrating the Holy Spirit at St. Bernard's Institute, in Rochester, New York, in 1983.

The text of the second hymn, "Like the Murmur of the Dove's Song," was written by American clergyman Carl Daw Jr. Dr. Daw has written over thirty hymn texts and a number of paraphrased Psalm settings, many of which are published in hymnals throughout the United States, Europe, Japan, and Australia. The tune, *Bridegroom*, was written in 1969 by English composer Peter Cutts (b. 1937). He is the composer of over 130 hymn tunes, some 90 of which appear in print throughout the English-speaking world. *Bridegroom*, his best-known tune, appears in almost all major hymnals and is sometimes set to multiple texts. It is used for two hymns in our hymnal: 314 and 531.

The text of "Come, O Spirit, Dwell Among Us," was written by American poet and lifelong Presbyterian Janie Alford (1887-1986). The tune *Ebenezer* (also called *Ton-Y-Botel*) was written by Welsh composer T. J. Williams (1869-1944). The tune is a sturdy, gutsy melody, moving from minor to major and back to minor, so characteristic of many Welsh tunes, and is in traditional A-A-B-A form, making it easily learned and remembered.
