We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.

If you are a guest with us this morning, our ushers are available to assist you.

Nursery care is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with an audio broadcast of worship is available downstairs in the Marks Room.

Children in Worship - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in chapel worship and children's activities. About This Morning's Music

The opening choir response is a setting of the *Preces*, a form of prayer which is one of the oldest in Christianity. The *Preces* finds its source in the pre-Christian Hebrew prayers of the Psalms in Temple Worship. The form consists of a series of short petitions by an individual, and responses by an ensemble.

The American composer and musicologist Byron Adams (b. 1955) writes distinctly tonal music for both choral and orchestral ensembles. His musicology writings focus primarily on British music of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Dr. Adams is a Professor of Music at the University of California, Riverside.

Peter Hallock (1924–2014) was a towering figure in twentieth-century American church music. During his forty years at St. Mark's Cathedral, Seattle, he produced a remarkable legacy: a daunting number of published and unpublished compositions, including numerous motets, as well as large-scale anthems with instrumental accompaniment.

Timothy Hagy is Director of Music and Organist of St. Thomas' Parish, Dupont Circle in Washington, D.C. Mr. Hagy received a Fulbright scholarship to study at the Vienna Conservatory of Music. After serving as Director of Music at the Cathedral of Saint John in Providence, Rhode Island, for eleven years, he taught at the Université de Cergy-Pontoise in Paris, before returning to the United States.

The theme of our stewardship season this fall is Romans 15:13, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." The choir and congregation together will sing the closing response, which is based on the Romans passage.

Mission Partner Spotlight

Our mission partner Urban Mosaic is working to eradicate injustice, poverty, and spiritual emptiness in the urban poor communities of the Chimalhuacan region of Mexico City. Founded in 2005, Urban Mosaic, led by Rev. Jean-Luc Krieg, has planted several house churches, is training and accompanying local pastors in holistic ministry, leading evangelistic Bible studies, training emerging youth leaders, and facilitating the growth of a new organization of residents who are organizing around community issues.

Shadyside Presbyterian Church members visited this ministry in 2009 and have committed to support their healthcare initiative, called ProSalud. Since the initial commitment of Shadyside's International Partnerships Mission Action Community (MAC), ten teams have traveled to the Chimalhuacan region, providing construction, educational, and medical services to several urban poor communities in central Mexico.

Our most recent project with Urban Mosaic involves a major financial commitment over three consecutive years to develop CentroRenovar, a spiritual retreat center in the mountains northeast of Mexico City. In March 2017, two separate teams traveled to Chimalhuacan to aid in the construction of this renewal center, which will provide support for local pastors, missionaries, volunteers, and future mission teams.
