We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.

If you are a guest with us this afternoon, our ushers are available to assist you.

Gluten-free, vegan Communion wafers are available in the Narthex for those who prefer them to the regular Communion bread.

Communion will be served through the practice of intinction. As ushers release your pews, you are invited to come forward to commune. Pull off a piece of bread held by the pastor, dip the bread into the cup the Communion server holds, and, after communing, you may return to your seat using the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward, please notify an usher, and we will be glad to bring the elements to you.

Nursery care is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with an audio broadcast of worship is available downstairs in the Marks Room, accessible by the staircase in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary.

A video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary.

Enlarged bulletins and individual listening devices for improved sound are available in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary. Please see an usher in the Narthex.

Restrooms are located off the Narthex and can be accessed by exiting the back of the Sanctuary and turning right. Additional restrooms are available at the top of the grand staircase through the Sharp Atrium.

Flower Ministry - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers. Centennial Anniversary of Armistice Day

Next Sunday, November 11, marks one hundred years since the end of hostilities during World War I.

In recognition of the centennial anniversary of Armistice Day, the names recorded on the World War I memorial plaque in the north transept of the Shadyside Presbyterian Church Sanctuary appear on page 7 of this afternoon's bulletin. The plaque was presented in 1920 by Mr. and Mrs. James H. Hammond to the glory of God with thanksgiving for peace and victory.

About This Afternoon's Music

Louis Vierne (1870-1937) is best known as an organist and composer for the organ. He was born blind; his sight was partially restored when he was six years old, although it remained very poor. He studied organ with César Franck and Charles-Marie Widor. In 1900, Vierne was appointed as head organist at Notre Dame Cathedral. He died of a heart attack while giving an organ recital (his 1,750th performance) at Notre Dame in 1937. Although Vierne wrote works in many different genres, his organ compositions, particularly the six organ symphonies, remain the best known. The *Messe Solennelle* was composed between 1899 and 1900. The premiere was at Saint-Sulpice, December 8, 1901; Charles-Marie Widor was at the grand organ in the rear of the church, and Louis Vierne was in the front of the church with the choir and the small choir organ, which doubled the choir parts.
