

Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.

If you are a guest with us this morning, our ushers are available to assist you.

Nursery care is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with an audio broadcast of worship is available downstairs in the Marks Room.

Children in Worship - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in children's chapel worship and Christian education. (If you are a first-time guest, please accompany your child to the Chapel, and then you may return to the Sanctuary.) Parents should meet their children in the Christian education classrooms after worship. On the first Sunday of the month, first- and second-graders stay in worship through the entire service for Communion. A bulletin insert designed for children is available in the Narthex.

A video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary.

Flower Ministry - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

Prayer Request Cards - You are invited to write on a Prayer Request Card the names of those who are sick or in need of intercessory prayer.

Enlarged bulletins and individual listening devices for improved sound are available in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary. Please see an usher for assistance.



About This Morning's Music

The opening choir response is a setting of the *Preces*, a form of prayer which is one of the oldest in Christianity. The *Preces* finds its source in the pre-Christian Hebrew prayers of the Psalms in Temple Worship. The form consists of a series of short petitions by an individual, and responses by an ensemble. This morning, the *Preces* is sung by the Chancel Choir and the Nazareth Choir.

Until March 2009, Grayston Ives (b. 1948) was *Informator Choristarum* (teacher of the choirboys), organist, and Fellow and Tutor in Music at Magdalen College, Oxford. His choral output ranges from canticles, anthems, and motets to arrangements of spirituals, folk songs, and "I've Got You Under My Skin." His "Listen, Sweet Dove," a setting of lines from George Herbert's collection of sacred poems *The Temple*, dates from 1973. Ives is a former member of the King's Singers, singing tenor from 1978 to 1985.

"As with Gladness Men of Old" is an Epiphany hymn, written by William Chatterton Dix on January 6, 1859, while he was ill in bed. Dix also wrote several hymns in our hymnal, including "What Child Is This?" and "Alleluia! Sing to Jesus." The hymn tune *Dix*, to which we sing "For the Beauty of the Earth," originally was written for the text "As with Gladness Men of Old," and named for Mr. Dix.

Mission Partner Spotlight

Over the past ten years, Shadyside Presbyterian Church (SPC) has used the Pittsburgh Marathon as a platform to raise funds and awareness for our mission partners. Once again this year, we will run with our mission partner Open Hand Ministries (OHM). OHM is committed to promoting justice and equality through home ownership in the East End of Pittsburgh. SPC and OHM welcome runners of any ability to join in running with a purpose at the 2019 Pittsburgh Marathon on Sunday, May 5. The marathon relay divides the 26.2-mile marathon course into five legs, ranging from 3.8 to 6.5 miles. Registration is free, but we ask each individual to participate in fundraising for OHM. Leadership Transitions - Last month, Session approved the recommendation of the Human Resources Committee to retain the Reverend Dr. John A. Dalles as Interim Senior Pastor; this action has been approved subsequently by the Pittsburgh Presbytery, and Dr. Dalles has joyfully accepted the appointment. A graduate of Pennsylvania State University and Lancaster and Pittsburgh Theological Seminaries, he has spent more than thirty-five years as a teaching elder and minister of word and sacrament in the Presbyterian Church (USA). A full biography of Dr. Dalles is published on the church website. With thanksgiving to God, we look forward to welcoming Dr. Dalles and his wife Judith in mid-February.

About the Cover Image

Shadyside Presbyterian Church’s baptismal font – located on the right side of the Sanctuary in front of the Chancel, adjacent to the lectern – is a substantial stone basin on pedestals with a wooden covering. There is ample carved symbolism on the font, which was custom designed for Shadyside by Charles Marcus Osborn during the Sanctuary remodeling in 1938.

The wave-like pattern is a clear reference to the baptismal waters, even the waters of the Jordan where John baptized Jesus. The shell motif is a common baptismal symbol for its use in pouring. The descending dove, pictured on this morning’s bulletin cover, refers to the Holy Spirit which came down upon Jesus.

Many fonts are eight sided, a form to which Shadyside’s base conforms. There is a reference to eight being the symbol of new life: Christ was resurrected on the “eighth day of Holy Week,” counting from Palm Sunday. Baptism’s connection is to the cleansing from sin to a new life, associating the Christian with Christ in His death, burial, and resurrection.

On a more fundamental level, the presence of a prominent baptismal font in the nave is, in itself, symbolic. Few photographs of the church’s Sanctuary from before 1937 exist. The presence of a free-standing font or a bowl is not apparent in them. A prominent, substantial font may signal the choice to place more emphasis on the sacraments, or perhaps, an urging to do so.
