

Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.

If you are a guest with us this morning, our ushers are available to assist you.

Nursery care is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with an audio broadcast of worship is available downstairs in the Marks Room.

Children in Worship - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in children's chapel worship and Christian education. (If you are a first-time guest, please accompany your child to the Chapel, and then you may return to the Sanctuary.) Parents should meet their children in the Christian education classrooms after worship. On the first Sunday of the month, first- and second-graders stay in worship through the entire service for Communion. A bulletin insert designed for children is available in the Narthex.

Flower Ministry - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

Prayer Request Cards - You are invited to write on a Prayer Request Card the names of those who are sick or in need of intercessory prayer.

Enlarged bulletins and individual listening devices for improved sound are available in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary. Please see an usher for assistance.

About This Morning's Music

The hymn tune *Werde Munte* (“Be Happy, O My Soul”) was composed by the prolific German composer Johann Schop (1590–1664). The tune was used at least twice in cantatas by Johann Sebastian Bach, as well as by Johann Pachelbel and Johann Walther.

Thomas Matthews (1915–1999) assisted Norman Coke-Jephcott at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City, where he continued to be influenced by the leading church musicians of the time – David McK. Williams, T. Tertius Noble, and Lynnwood Farnam. He has held positions as organist/choirmaster at St. Martin-in-the-Fields in Chestnut Hill, Philadelphia, as well as St. Luke’s in Evanston, Illinois. He also served on the Northwestern University School of Music faculty and was director of music for Seabury-Western Theological Seminary. His final post was as organist/choirmaster at Trinity Church in Tulsa, Oklahoma, where he served on the faculty of the University of Tulsa.

Carlyle Sharpe (b. 1965) is Professor of Music in Composition and Theory at Drury University in Springfield, Missouri. He is in high demand as a composer for both choral and chamber music.

Mission Partner Spotlight

The Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank (GPCFB) literally distributes tons of food each month to low-income neighborhoods around the city. Before food reaches the homes of families in need, it is touched by the hands of many volunteers. (Only twenty-five percent of all food is handled by paid employees of the food bank.) Without the assistance of community volunteers, most of the food would go to waste before it ever reached those who need it most. Shadyside provides volunteers for the food distribution efforts of GPCFB.
