*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with an audio broadcast of worship is available downstairs in the Marks Room.

**Children in Worship** - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in children's chapel worship and Christian education. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

## About This Morning's Music

First performed in 1903, *The Apostles* is an oratorio for soloists, chorus, and orchestra in two parts, composed by Edward Elgar (1857-1934). Elgar chose the text from various parts of the New Testament and the Apocrypha. The work is scored for large orchestra, of typical late-Romantic proportions, with the addition of a shofar. There is a double chorus with semichorus, and six solo singers representing the Blessed Virgin, the Angel Gabriel, Mary Magdalene, St. John, Jesus, and Judas. The oratorio, like its successor *The Kingdom*, depicts the disciples of Jesus and their reactions to the extraordinary events surrounding them. "The Spirit of the Lord" is the best-known portion of this work.
