

# Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you. Following worship, we invite those who are new to the church to join us under the ficus tree in the Sharp Atrium, where New Member Committee representatives will greet you and answer any questions you may have.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with an audio broadcast of worship is available downstairs in the Marks Room.

**Children in Worship** - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in children's chapel worship and Christian education. (If you are a first-time guest, please accompany your child to the Chapel, and then you may return to the Sanctuary.) Parents should meet their children in the Christian education classrooms after worship. On the first Sunday of the month, first- and second-graders stay in worship through the entire service for Communion. A bulletin insert designed for children is available in the Narthex.

**A video broadcast** of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary.

**Flower Ministry** - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

**Prayer Request Cards** - You are invited to write on a Prayer Request Card the names of those who are sick or in need of intercessory prayer.

**Enlarged bulletins and individual listening devices for improved sound** are available in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary. Please see an usher for assistance.

**Fifth Avenue Parking** - Parking on the inbound side of the block from Wilkins Avenue to Amberson Avenue is not available on Sunday mornings. Parking is available on the outbound side as well as both sides of Fifth Avenue from Amberson Avenue into Oakland. ## About This Morning's Music

The opening choir response is a setting of the Preces, a form of prayer which is one of the oldest in Christianity. The Preces finds its source in the pre-Christian Hebrew prayers of the Psalms in Temple Worship. The form consists of a series of short petitions by an individual, and responses by an ensemble. This morning, the Preces is sung by the Chancel Choir and the Nazareth Choir.

Harold Friedell (May 11, 1905, Jamaica, Queens, New York–February 17, 1958, Hastings-on-Hudson, New York) was an American organist, choirmaster, teacher, and composer. At an early age, he served as organist at First Methodist Episcopal Church (Jamaica, Queens). He later served as organist at Calvary Episcopal Church (New York), organist and choirmaster at Saint John's Church (Jersey City, New Jersey), organist and choirmaster at Calvary Church (New York), and finally organist and master of the choir at Saint Bartholomew's Church (New York). Friedell also taught on the faculty of the Union Theological Seminary School of Sacred Music (New York). As a composer, Friedell composed works for organ, orchestra, and choir, as well as hymn tunes, descants, and music for solo voice. He is best known for his work at Saint Bartholomew's, and for his setting of "Draw Us in the Spirit's Tether," this morning's first anthem and hymn no. 504 in our hymnal.

Mendelssohn's "For He Shall Give His Angels Charge Over Thee" is from the oratorio *Elijah*, written in 1846. *Elijah* is modeled on the oratorios of Bach and Handel.

## About the Cover

The cross located on the Communion table in the Chancel of the Shadyside Presbyterian Church Sanctuary is shown in detail on this morning's bulletin cover. The inscription of "IHS" in the central medallion is a Christogram symbolizing Jesus Christ; the monogram is taken from an abbreviation of the name of Jesus in Greek. The characters engraved at the ends of the left and right arms of the cross are Alpha and Omega, the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. These, too, represent Christ, who proclaims in Revelation 22:13, "*I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end.*"

# About the Liturgical Season of Lent

Lent is a forty-day season in the Church patterned after Christ's forty days in the wilderness, during which our Lord prepared for His ministry of self-giving, teaching, healing, and giving His life on the cross. During these forty days, Christ's followers seek to center their thoughts and lives upon Jesus. To do this, we may choose to share in acts of learning, of wellness, and of self-denial: dying to the old self and putting on the new identity centered in the Spirit of God.

## Mission Partner Spotlight

Our mission partner Urban Mosaic is working to eradicate injustice, poverty, and spiritual emptiness in the urban poor communities of the Chimalhuacan region of Mexico City. Founded in 2005, Urban Mosaic, led by Rev. Jean-Luc Krieg, has planted several house churches, is training and accompanying local pastors in holistic ministry, leading evangelistic Bible studies, training emerging youth leaders, and facilitating the growth of a new organization of residents who are organizing around community issues.

Shadyside Presbyterian Church members visited this ministry in 2009 and have committed to support their healthcare initiative, called ProSalud. Since the initial commitment of Shadyside's International Partnerships Mission Action Community (MAC), ten teams have traveled to the Chimalhuacan region, providing construction, educational, and medical services to several urban poor communities in central Mexico.

Our most recent project with Urban Mosaic involves a major financial commitment over three consecutive years to develop CentroRenovar, a spiritual retreat center in the mountains northeast of Mexico City. In March 2017, two separate teams traveled to Chimalhuacan to aid in the construction of this renewal center, which will provide support for local pastors, missionaries, volunteers, and future mission teams.
