

# Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

*We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.*

**If you are a guest with us this morning**, our ushers are available to assist you. Following worship, we invite those who are new to the church to join us under the ficus tree in the Sharp Atrium, where New Member Committee representatives will greet you and answer any questions you may have.

**Gluten-free, vegan Communion wafers** are available in the Narthex for those who prefer them to the regular Communion bread.

**Nursery care** is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with an audio broadcast of worship is available downstairs in the Marks Room.

**Children in Worship** - At 11:00 a.m., families with two- and three-year-olds are welcome to report directly to the Nursery. Four-year-olds through second-graders attend worship and may exit with their teachers before the sermon to participate in children's chapel worship and Christian education. (If you are a first-time guest, please accompany your child to the Chapel, and then you may return to the Sanctuary.) Parents should meet their children in the Christian education classrooms after worship. On the first Sunday of the month, first- and second-graders stay in worship through the entire service for Communion. A bulletin insert designed for children is available in the Narthex.

**A video broadcast** of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary.

**Flower Ministry** - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers.

**Prayer Request Cards** - You are invited to write on a Prayer Request Card the names of those who are sick or in need of intercessory prayer.

**Enlarged bulletins and individual listening devices for improved sound** are available in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary. Please see an usher for assistance.

**Time of Fellowship** immediately follows worship. Please join us after the service for light refreshments and an opportunity to greet each other.

## About This Morning's Music

American composer René Clausen (b. 1953) is conductor of the Concordia Choir and professor of music at Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota.

The text of the offering anthem comes from George Herbert's collection of poems, *The Temple* (1633). American organist and composer Gerre Hancock set the text for Westminster Presbyterian Church in Lincoln, Nebraska.

One of the most prominent and prolific composers of our time, Stephen Paulus (1949–2014) wrote over 400 works which have received premieres and performances throughout the world. "Pilgrim's Hymn" comes from a one-act religious opera, *The Three Hermits* (Tolstoy), commissioned by House of Hope Presbyterian Church in St. Paul, Minnesota.

The final hymn today is brand new, and was written for this particular service of worship. The text is by our own Rev. Dr. John Dalles, set to a tune composed by our own Mark Anderson, who also composed the *Kyrie* and *Gloria Patri* we sing regularly (including this morning). Dr. Dalles is the author of numerous hymn texts, including "Come, O Spirit" and "God, Bless Your Church with Strength," which are included in the 1990 Presbyterian Hymnal. His commissioned hymns include those for Presbyterian Heritage Sunday, Augsburg, Goshen, Maryville, Tusculum, Wilson and Knox (Toronto) Colleges, American University, Pittsburgh and Lancaster Seminaries, Peachtree Presbyterian Church, and the Lutheran World Federation. A life-member of the Hymn Society, Dr. Dalles has published three collections of hymns: *Swift Currents and Still Waters* (2000), *We Turn To God* (2010), and *God Is the Singer's Friend* (2013).

## Mission Partner Spotlight

Open Hand Ministries (OHM) is a ministry of four churches located in Garfield and East Liberty committed to promoting justice and equality through homeownership. OHM helps to revitalize the community by converting abandoned properties into safe and energy-efficient homes. OHM also helps first-time homeowners to develop the skills which will lead them to financial stability and strength, and continues in relationship with these families long after they move in.

Shadyside volunteers help to renovate these homes, doing everything from demolition at the start of the project to painting at the end. OHM welcomes volunteers to join them on the first Saturday of each month; no prior experience required. There also are opportunities to participate in the client care teams which walk alongside the families as they prepare for homeownership and beyond.

Over the past ten years, Shadyside has used the Pittsburgh Marathon as a platform to raise funds and awareness for our mission partners. This year, we are again honored to run with OHM. ### John Walker Organ Recital & Gala

The American Guild of Organists (AGO) has selected internationally acclaimed organist and teacher John Walker as the honoree for the 2019 AGO Endowment Fund Distinguished Artist Award Recital and Gala Benefit Reception on Friday, April 26. The celebration begins with a free recital by Dr. Walker at Shadyside Presbyterian Church at 7:30 p.m. Scheduled on the Friday immediately following Easter, the program will feature music tracing the path from Palm Sunday through Holy Week and Eastertide, including Guilman's stirring *March on Handel's "Lift Up Your Heads"*; Virgil Fox's transcription of Bach's *Come, Sweet Death*; and John Knowles Paine's virtuosic *Concert Variations on Old Hundred*; along with other selections. This recital also commemorates the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the inaugural recital on Shadyside's magnificent four-manual 106-rank Reuter organ. John Weaver's *Sine nomine*, which the composer premiered on this organ in 1994 at the inaugural recital, will be a featured composition.

(No tickets are necessary for admission to the recital.)

The Gala Reception (advance tickets required) benefitting the AGO Endowment Fund will follow the recital at Mansions on Fifth, an elegant Gilded Age hotel, located just a few steps from the church. Guests will enjoy hors d'oeuvres while mingling and visiting with John Walker. John Walker is immediate past president of the AGO. Following an earlier distinguished tenure at the Riverside Church in the City of New York, Dr. Walker served as Minister of Music at Shadyside Presbyterian Church from 1992 to 2004. He is Minister of Music Emeritus at Brown Memorial Presbyterian Church in Baltimore and Professor of Organ at the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University.
