

Welcome to Shadyside Presbyterian Church

We are grateful for your presence and invite you to participate in the worship, study, fellowship, and service of this congregation.

If you are a guest with us this afternoon, our ushers are available to assist you.

Gluten-free, vegan Communion wafers are available in the Narthex for those who prefer them to the regular Communion bread.

Communion will be served through the practice of intinction. As ushers release your pews, you are invited to come forward to the Chancel, where a pastor and Communion server will be waiting for you. You will receive a piece of bread from the pastor; dip the bread into the cup the Communion server holds, and, after communing, you may return to your seat using the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward, please notify an usher, and we will be glad to bring the elements to you.

Nursery care is available for infants through three-year-olds during worship. Pagers are available. A cry room with an audio broadcast of worship is available downstairs in the Marks Room, accessible by the staircase in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary.

A video broadcast of worship is available in the Craig Room, accessible through the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary.

Enlarged bulletins and individual listening devices for improved sound are available in the Narthex at the back of the Sanctuary. Please see an usher in the Narthex.

Restrooms are located off the Narthex and can be accessed by exiting the back of the Sanctuary and turning right. Additional restrooms are available at the top of the grand staircase through the Sharp Atrium.

Flower Ministry - After worship, members of the Board of Deacons' Flower Ministry divide the chancel flowers into bouquets to be distributed to individuals who are celebrating joyous occasions and to those who could use some cheer. If you would like to deliver a bouquet to someone you know, please stop by the front of the Sanctuary after worship to receive one. Help us to share God's love through flowers. In observance of All Saints' Day, if you would like to receive a bouquet of flowers in honor of a departed loved one, you are welcome to come to the front of the Sanctuary following this afternoon's service.
