**Planted People**



If you open up this Kids' Bulletin, you will see a big tree with many branches. There is a stream running below it filled with different words. During worship, take some time to draw leaves and fruit on the tree. Inside the leaves and fruit, write good things that happen when we do the things we see printed in the stream. What good things happen when you pray? What good things happen when you come to church? What good things happen when you read the bible?

When a tree slurps-up water from a stream, it grows stronger and gets leaves and fruit. When people pray, learn, sing, go to church, read the bible, and love God, we grow too.

**Where in the Word is the Word?**


