

**What time is it?**



Did you know there are many ways to tell time? Most of us use the movement of the sun to tell time. We say a day is twenty-four hours and a year is 365 days.

We divide the “sun year” into four seasons: spring, summer, fall, and winter.

The Church’s year is “Christological,” because it is based on the major events of Jesus Christ’s life: birth, life, death, resurrection, and ascension and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

We divide the “Christ year” into seasons as well: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. (Berryman, 1989). Today is “Reign of Christ Sunday” or “Christ the King Sunday.” This is the last Sunday in the Church’s liturgical year. Next Sunday, we start a new year.

**Where in the Word is the Word?**

The Word can mean many things:

- The Word = God’s messages for God’s people
- The Word = Jesus, God’s Son
- The Word = The Bible, the story of God’s people
- The Word = A sermon or homily spoken

**Good Shepherds and Bad Shepherds**

*Jeremiah 23:1-6*


This description of Jeremiah 23:1-6 from the book “Feasting on the Word” by Carol Wehrheim may help you in understanding more about Pastor Austin’s sermon today.

“Jeremiah was a prophet of God. In those days, God spoke to the prophets and gave them messages for the people of God, the Israelites. The Old Testament part of our Bible has many books of the words that were given to the prophets.

Jeremiah was the son of a priest. The first time God spoke to Jeremiah and told him he was to be a ‘prophet of all nations,’ Jeremiah answered, ‘Not me, God, I am just a child..’

But God answered, ‘Don’t be afraid. I am with you. I will put the words in your mouth.’

The words God gave Jeremiah weren’t always happy words. Often the words made the people of God angry. But the words also gave hope to the Israelites, if they would just listen. Once, God gave Jeremiah words about good and bad shepherds. But the words were really about the kings of Israel. Listen carefully (to Jeremiah 23:1-6) and think about what the kings might think about these words:



‘You shepherds who send the sheep off in all directions, watch out! These are God’s words. This is how you *tend* my people. You drive them away, north, south, east, and west. You don’t take good care of them, so I will make you sorry. I will gather the sheep myself. I will bring them to my good pasture. Then they will be healthy and have many lambs. I will find shepherds who will care for them with love. Then my sheep will not be afraid and nothing bad will happen to them. And none of them will be missing.’”

These words probably made the kings angry and may have even scared them a little. These words gave Jeremiah and God’s people hope.
